New Trip Boat Kitty Gets JP Colours





Countdown To Woking Canal Festival

With much still to do, the Woking Canal Festival will soon be upon us. It takes place on August 6th and 7th 2016, at Common Brookhouse Woking. It looks set to be a spectacular affair and celebrates two significant anniversaries. Firstly, it commemorates the 25th year since the Canal was reopened, following many years of restoration effort, mainly by Society volunteers. This set of photos showing how the Canal



once looked in Woking illustrates what they were up against. This year is also the 50th Anniversary of The Basingstoke Canal Society, which was founded in 1966 by a collection of enthusiasts who were offended by the parlous state of the Canal and decided to do something about it.

We are being joined at the Festival by members of the Historic Narrow Boat Club, who also are celebrating their 50th. Their historic ex-working boats will shortly be arriving on the Canal. Fittingly, about 50 in all (including some local boats) are eventually expected to tie up along the towpath between Chobham Road Bridge, alongside the Festival site, and towards Monument Bridge. Both Festival days will commence with procession of the historic boats, which will proceed from the Festival site upstream to Bridge Barn from around 10am. With so many boats taking part, it is likely to be chaotic, but it will look good. A full programme of public events will take place on-site, followed each evening by member-only events, including "birthday parties" for each organisation (see overleaf).

Much Festival Activity Going On In The Background



As can be imagined, a huge amount of planning, organisation and sheer hard work is necessary in advance of an event like a Canal Festival. This has been undertaken by an organising committee that includes members from both the Society and the Historic Narrow Boat Club.

Thankfully, a large force of volunteers have stepped forward and will be helping on the weekend with everything from setting up, stewarding, site control, the information stand, parking for officials and visitors, crewing the water bus, clearing up and tear-down. Inevitably though, not all slots are filled all of the time, so more help is needed:

We have a particular need for additional stewards to cover the main entrances to the site and private carparks over 2 hour shifts at various times during the weekend. You will be providing directions to people to and around the site. You will be fully briefed and equipped beforehand, and you will be provided with a free Festival T-shirt if you confirm your interest **by Friday of this week (22nd July)** to <u>Dick King</u> by <u>email</u> or on 01730 264178.
