

The Basingstoke Canal today is a lovely stretch of water, towpaths and parks, winding its way for 32 miles through Hampshire and Surrey. It is enjoyed by thousands of walkers, cyclists, anglers and boaters throughout the year.

This beautiful waterway supports diverse and rare flora and fauna and is a designated Site of Special Scientific Interest (SSSI), very different from the derelict canal threatened with abandonment fifty years ago.

The Basingstoke Canal Society has been determined to keep the Canal alive, working with the 'Canal Partnership' to rescue and revive this beautiful link to the past. A mainly volunteer workforce rebuilt

> locks and bridges, dredged the channel and cleared overgrown banks over 25 years, before the Canal was finally re-opened in 1991.

Today volunteers are still working to help ensure the Canal will continue to thrive and survive for the use and enjoyment of generations to come.
