

Works recently undertaken by The Basingstoke Canal Society or on the Society's behalf by visiting Waterway Recovery Group work parties







All of these projects have been undertaken by volunteers, and are partly or fully funded by the Canal Society from the proceeds from our two trip boats comprising the *John Pinkerton Canal Cruises* operation.

Each year the Society generates cash funding of about £50k, and provides volunteer labour equivalent to a value of around £200k, towards the Basingstoke Canal.

The Basingstoke Canal Society works in partnership with the Canal's owners, the Surrey and Hampshire County Councils, and their agent the Basingstoke Canal Authority, to maintain, promote and secure the Canal as a navigable waterway, general amenity, a heritage asset, and as a host to wildlife.

During the period 2011-2019 the owners have invested around £6m of capital in the Canal.
